The purpose of this role is
to develop and grow the
Children and Families ministry
in the Benefice that has an
emphasis on helping people
inside and outside the church
to encounter Jesus through the
Holy Spirit and to become
disciples.

The job will partly be what you make it, but it will include:

- ⚙ Developing and growing a children's ministry that enables young people to encounter Jesus.



- ⚙ A Pioneering Role: reaching out to children, young people and families who don't yet know Jesus by developing our links with schools and our other community outreach events.

- ⚙ Ensuring that the children's ministry is in line with the vision of the Benefice.



- ⚙ Helping children, young people and their families in their discipleship, faith and expectancy that God can use them in the 'church of today'.

- ⚙ Developing and engaging with a team of volunteers to work with our young people.

- ⚙ Building a strong sense of community amongst young people and families that is welcoming.



- ⚙ Working with a Line Manager, the Team Rector, who has over 9 years' experience of supervising children and youth workers.

- ⚙ Connecting with the area network of children and youth ministers for support, encouragement and mentoring.

The Right Candidate will...

...be a committed Christian with a good knowledge of the Bible, an awareness of maintaining their own spiritual growth and an enthusiasm to pass on their faith and love of Jesus by teaching and example. There is a Genuine Occupational Requirement (GOR) that the holder of this post is a practising Christian

...have a real love of working with children and proven experience of teaching and nurturing children and young people in the Christian Faith

...have experience in setting up events suitable for families and children, showing imagination and creativity to help adults and children to become pilgrims along the road of faith with all members of our congregations

...be able to work as part of a team, working alongside clergy and senior members of the congregations of all four churches to devise and plan ways of outreach

Person Specification



The Right Candidate will...

...have proven experience in recruiting, enthusing and developing volunteers to establish meaningful and lasting activities which will promote the work with children and families within the parishes

...have an ability to listen and get alongside adults and children of all ages and backgrounds.

...be a self-starter with a high degree of personal initiative who can own the vision for our children and families work and develop it, recruit and lead a volunteer team, and balance their workload with time to stop, reflect, pray and plan

...be able to forge close contacts and work well with the wider church team, local organisations, schools, other church children and family Ministers

...be willing to engage fully in the life of the benefice, is flexible and willing to respond to any perceived needs.

Person Specification



The right candidate MUST

have an understanding and experience of the work of the Holy Spirit in and through children and young people

have a driving license and their own transport

have experience of leading children and family work, planning exciting and creative teaching, programmes and events

be a strong committed Christian of good character, who is prayerful and models the renewing work of the Holy Spirit

Have strong communication skills and an ability to think strategically

schedule and manage their workload well, and those of others to optimal capacity

possess strong IT skills and experience of using Microsoft Word, Excel, Instagram and other social media platforms

have experience of leading children and young people to faith and helping them to grow as disciples

be able to provide clearly documented information to support all their work

be a good team player, able to build a strong network both within and outside the churches of the Benefice



The right candidate may have:

- ✖ A recognised qualification in children or youth ministry
- ✖ Experience of working in a voluntary organization
- ✖ Understanding of the operation of the Church of England at a local level



Other Responsibilities

The scope of the role will further require you to be able to:

- safely recruit, train and equip volunteers
- work with the Benefice Safeguarding Lead and ensure that the Benefice children and family ministry implements and follows our safeguarding policies and procedures
- follow and implement all the Benefice and PCC policies including legal requirements such as Data Protection and ensure Risk Assessments are prepared
- manage a ministry budget accurately and efficiently
- work with wider ministries of the church to ensure effective co-ordination
- be willing to step outside their current work boundaries to attend, participate and help with church wide events.



- Formal qualifications may not be necessary, but the candidate should have a good level of education and be able to communicate with individuals and larger groups.
- Should be willing to work flexible hours in agreement with their line manager and be able manage their own time schedule efficiently.
- Safeguarding: understand and follow the Safeguarding standards of the Diocese and Benefice and complete the required training. This post is subject to enhanced disclosure from DBS.
- GDPR: understand and follow GDPR requirements for local church life.

The Package:



Role is 40 hours a week, with a requirement to work on Sunday mornings and other hours outside of 'core' office hours.



Salary is £34,000 per annum



Three-year contract with potential for extension

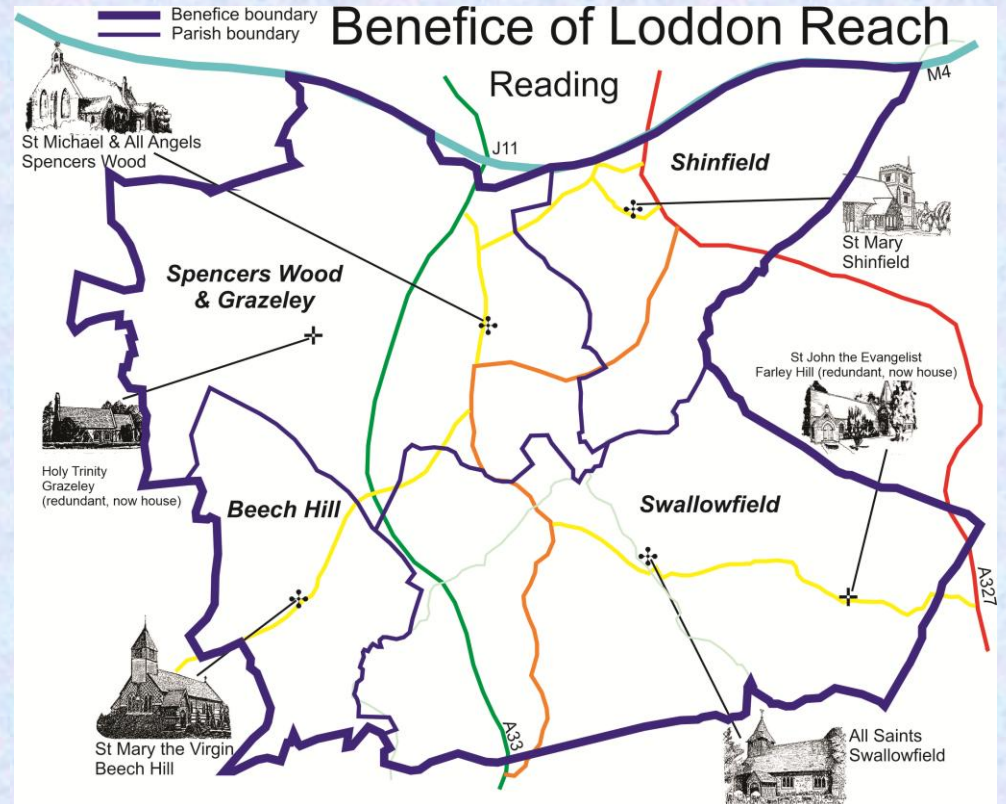


Expenses of office and travel expenses will be reimbursed
